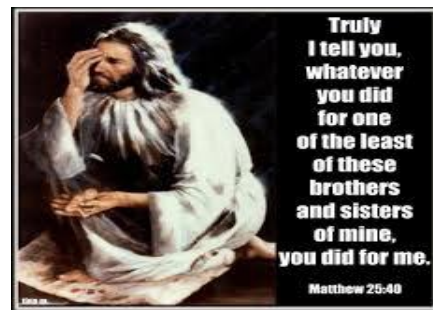

The St. Eugene Church Parish Community has various groups that do great work to provide for the poor and less fortunate. The St. Eugene Church Conference of St. Vincent de Paul works throughout the year to feed the poor, clothe the naked, provides resources to shelter the homeless, and assist the less fortunate in various other ways.

Our St. Eugene Church Parish Outreach continues to prepare and provide bagged meals, water, blankets, warming emergency blankets, and other much needed resources to 50-100 homeless individuals in Woonsocket.

While some people are doing these works hands on, none of it is possible without the generosity and donations of our parish community. It greatly pleases the Lord when we come together as a parish community to take care of His children through these Corporal Works of Mercy!
